Module Three: Serious Illness Communication (Part 1)
55 minutes

Module at a Glance

This module is the first of two modules focused on serious illness communication. This module highlights some of the key data in terms of benefits of having goals of care/end of life conversations with patients and families and what patients and families desire from these conversations. It also reviews four critical communication skills and then asks participants to reflect on the use of these skills through a video review. Facilitator notes are included in the powerpoint.

Learning Objectives

1. Identify challenges and best practices when communicating with seriously ill patients and families.
2. Describe and practice four skills to enhance your communication with seriously ill patients and families.
